WELCOME

As the person in charge of tourism, you have been asked to produce an information pack for visitors to your region from French-speaking countries.

Your information pack could include information on:

- the location of the region;
- things to do and see in the area;
- things you hope they will include on their holiday itinerary;
- an advertisement for a local upcoming event;
- instructions on what they need to bring to ensure a successful holiday e.g. sunscreen.

Your information pack could take the form of a brochure, a poster, a reference from a past visitor, a PowerPoint etc.

To reach the standard of **achievement** you must:

- give relevant information;
- use simple language up to and including CL6;
- write a minimum of about 120 words but remember quality is more important than quantity.

What you write must be able to be understood despite any errors.

To reach the standard of **merit** you must:

- give relevant information with some development;
- use a variety of simple language up to and including CL6;
- write a minimum of about 120 words but remember quality is more important than quantity.

What you write must have no errors that significantly hinder communication.

To reach the standard of **excellence** you must

- give relevant information with substantial development;
- use a wide variety of simple language up to and including CL 6;
- write a minimum of about 120 words but remember quality is more important than quantity.

What you write must be able to be understood, AND there should be no errors hindering communication.
